


Review Time

Conversation Stations

Group Activity Time provides an active learning experience to review lesson concepts.

Option #1 - Sweet vs. Sour

What you need: Sour gummy candy, sweet gummy candy

What you do: Have the children sit on the floor. Give each child a sour gummy candy to sample. When all are finished, give each child a sweet gummy candy to sample. Be aware of food allergies.

What you say: Which did you like better - the sour candy or the sweet candy? In our story today we learned that Job's friends didn't say kind words to him. Is that the kind of friend Job needed? No, he needed friends who would say kind words to him. Show me what your face looked like when you ate the sweet candy. A smile! Kind words make our friends smile. What kind words can you say to a friend?

Option #2 - Kind vs. Unkind

What you need: An open space on the floor

What you do: Have the children sit on the floor. Remind them that kind words make our friends smile. Tell them to show you "thumbs up" for kind words or "thumbs down" for unkind words.

- You're not my friend.
- Can I help you?
- I don't like you.

- I don't want to play with you.
- You are a good friend.
- What do you want to play?
- Do you want to share with me?

What you say: In our story today we learned that Job's friends were unkind. They didn't say kind words to him. Is that the kind of friend Job needed? No, he needed friends who would say kind words to him. Kind words make our friends smile. What kind words can you say to a friend?

Option #3 - Toss a Smile

What you need: An open space on the floor


What you do: Players sit in a circle, making sure they can see everyone else. One player who is "It" starts the game by smiling widely, while all the other players are sad. "It" then uses his hand to wipe the smile off his face and toss it to another player who has to catch the smile with his hand and put it on. This new "It" can then wipe off the smile to throw to someone else. Play until all children have had a turn to toss the smile.

What you say: In our story today we learned that Job's friends were unkind. They didn't say kind words to him. Is that the kind of friend Job needed? No, he needed friends who would say kind words to him. Kind words make our friends smile. What kind words can you say to a friend?

Kind Face/Unkind Face puppet

Supplies:

- Small paper plates (2 per child)
- Large popsicle sticks
- Wiggly eyes
- Markers/Crayons
- Stapler
- Glue



Directions:

- 1. Give each child 2 small paper plates. On one, color a kind face and glue on eyes. On the other, color an unkind face and glue on eyes.
- 2. Glue or staple the paper plates back to back with the popsicle stick as a handle.






