Application Point

I can be a friend like Jesus

Bible Story

Jesus heals the blind men Matthew 20:29-34



Review Time

Gather the children and use the Review Cards to recap the story and apply the lesson to their lives. End with prayer.

Conversation Stations/Check-Out

Conversation Stations

Group Activity Time provides an active learning experience to review lesson concepts.

Option #1 - Musical Hugs

What you need: Open space for the children to move around, music

What you do: This game is very similar to musical chairs. The leader plays music and the children dance to the music. When the leader stops the music, the children find a friend to hug (nice, gentle hugs). Every time the music stops, the children must find a different person to hug.

What to say: We hugged our friends in our game today didn't we? Jesus chose to be a friend to the men whose eyes didn't work, even when no one else wanted to be their friend. Do you know someone who needs a friend? What can you say to someone who needs a friend?

Option #2 - Good Friend/Bad Friend

What you need: An open space on the floor

What you do: Have the children sit on the floor. Tell them to show you a "thumbs up" for a good friend or "thumbs down" for a bad friend.

- · A new boy comes to class and you ask him to play with you
- You stomp away mad when you can't choose the game to play
- · You get mad at your friend and hit her in the arm
- You share your snack with a friend
- You let your friend choose which toy you will play with together
- · Your friend falls down in the sand and you run away to play somewhere else

What you say: Today we are talking about how to be a friend to everyone. Jesus chose to be a friend to the men whose eyes didn't work, even when no one else wanted to be their friend. Do you know someone who needs a friend? What can you say to someone who needs a friend?

Option #3 – Blind Man Obstacle Course

What you need: A large, open space


What you do: Have the children pair up with a buddy. One child will close his eyes and the other child will carefully guide the "blind" child around a set course in the room. One leader can lead the procession. Go slowly and remind the children to help the "blind" friend around any obstacles. Trade places and play again.

What you say: In our game today you helped each other. Was that hard not being able to see where you were going? Jesus helped the men whose eyes didn't work. Jesus chose to be a friend to those men, even when no one else wanted to be their friend. Do you know someone who needs a friend? What can you say to someone who needs a friend?

Blind Man Face

Directions:

- 1. Copy the craft page onto cardstock. Either precut the two faces (for younger preschoolers) or have the children cut out the faces.

- Put the blind face on top of the seeing face. Attach at the top with a brad.


