One Nation, Under God A Price?!

World Outreach Church Sermon Discussion Guide Sunday Sermon: **July 07, 2024**



The best pathway forward for our nation is to recognize we rest under God's authority. If we imagine ourselves to be a nation without God's authority, we'll lose the liberties and freedoms that originated from God, Himself. We can only make withdrawals from the sacrifices of previous generations for so long before we become bankrupt—morally, socially, economically, and in our faith. Every generation must make a choice for themselves, and in many segments of our culture—even in the Church—there's a tremendous reluctance today to say something as simple as "God bless America"—as if it's inappropriate. Well, how else do we imagine we'll find a better future? We live in a remarkable nation that's blessed by God. What if we began to act like what God said about us could shape our future? That will take a new plan, new habits, new heroes, and a new imagination of the price of freedom and liberty.

Equity is getting a lot of play recently. It's the idea that everyone gets an equal outcome—not an equal opportunity, which is *equality*. An equal outcome is *equity*—and both biblically and ideologically, it's a false construct. It's also not an idea that is supported by reality. Equal outcomes require stealing.

1. Equity refers to equal outcomes for all. In what ways has our culture been manipulated to embrace equity? How has this diminished us, as a society?

I. REVIEW

Hebrews 11:32-33 (The Message*) 32 I could go on and on, but I've run out of time. There are so many more—Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel, the prophets. ... 33 Through acts of faith, they toppled kingdoms, made justice work, took the promises for themselves.

Ephesians 3:20 (The Message *) God can do anything, you know—far more than you could ever imagine or guess or request in your wildest dreams! He does it not by pushing us around but by working within us, his Spirit deeply and gently within us.

2. Share how God gently showed up in your life in a place or in a way that you weren't expecting.

II. A PRICE . . .

Luke 14:28–33 28 "Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Will he not first sit down and estimate the cost to see if he has enough money to complete it? ²⁹ For if he lays the foundation and is not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule him, ³⁰ saying, 'This fellow began to build and was not able to finish.' ³¹ Or suppose a king is about to go to war against another king. Will he not first sit down and consider whether he is able with ten thousand men to oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand? ³² If he is not able, he will send a delegation while the other is still a long way off and will ask for terms of peace.

"33 In the same way, any of you who does not give up everything he has cannot be my disciple."

Crescens has gone to Galatia, and Titus to Dalmatia. ¹¹ Only Luke is with me. Get Mark and bring him with you, because he is helpful to me in my ministry. ¹² I sent Tychicus to Ephesus. ¹³ When you come, bring the cloak that I left with Carpus at Troas, and my scrolls, especially the parchments.

¹⁴ Alexander the metalworker did me a great deal of harm. The Lord will repay him for what he has done. ¹⁵ You too should be on your guard against him, because he strongly opposed our message. ¹⁶ At my first defense, no one came to my support, but everyone deserted me. May it not be held against them. ¹⁷ But the Lord stood at my side and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. And I was delivered from the lion's mouth. ¹⁸ The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and will bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen. ... ²¹ Do your best to get here before winter ... ²² The Lord be with your spirit. Grace be with you.

III. ADVERSITY, ADVERSARIES, & ANTAGONISTS

- A. The Most Consistent Characteristic of Heroes -- Great Opponents
 - 2 Corinthians 11:23-29 ²³ I have worked much harder, been in prison more frequently, been flogged more severely, and been exposed to death again and again. ²⁴ Five times I received from the Jews the forty lashes minus one. ²⁵ Three times I was beaten with rods, once I was stoned, three times I was shipwrecked, I spent a night and a day in the open sea, ²⁶ I have been constantly on the move. I have been in danger from rivers, in danger from bandits, in danger from my own countrymen, in danger from Gentiles; in danger in the city, in danger in the country, in danger at sea; and in danger from false brothers.
 - ²⁷I have labored and toiled and have often gone without sleep; I have known hunger and thirst and have often gone without food; I have been cold and naked. ²⁸ Besides everything else, I face daily the pressure of my concern for all the churches.
- B. Adversaries Accomplish . . .
 - 1. Adversaries prepare us for useful service. (Joseph)
 - 2. Adversaries expose our fears. (Moses)
 - 3. Adversaries elevate us to a new level of trust and faith. (Esther)
 - 4. Adversaries define our progress. (David)
- C. The benefit of adversity is realized in the victory!

Revelation 3:12 Him who overcomes I will make a pillar in the temple of my God.
